Wonderland: The Ghostman Of Skye

10.40pm, BBC2 Donald Angus Maclean collects the myriad ghost stories of his home, the Isle of Skye. Donald's pastime is seemingly bound up with mourning for his dead wife, Nina, but whatever his motivations, the island certainly throws up some spooky tales, such as The Car That Wasn't There. For all the gloom that hangs over this documentary - and as filmed here, Skye is ominously forbidding and grey - Donald himself, a former missionary, is philosophical about the end of life. Death omens, he says, come in the light, so perhaps the beyond isn't really as dark as we think. JW
